The Coaching Manual Software Demo:

A representative from The Coaching Manual will demonstrate their training session software

USSF Club Development Manager (CDM), “Beyond Grassroots”:

Using the 5 W’s to write a Training Objective and guiding players through the Orientation, Learning, and Implementation phases of a training session. This is a player centered training approach that focuses on replicating the demands and visual cues of the game along with a variety of coaching methods to develop autonomous players.

Stack Sports:

Product enhancements, services offered, and how these items can help your club, league, and teams.

New Mexico United:

USSF CDM, Breakout Session for Technical Leads

“Building a Player Development Plan”:

Interactive workshop designed to improve a club’s ability to design a comprehensive Player Development Plan or evaluate and improve their current plan. This will be an opportunity to take a closer look at and dig into the connection between Style of Play, Team Tactical Principles, and designing Age-Appropriate Curriculum.

Annual General Meeting/Election of Officers:

Official reports, budget vote, and election of officers are highlights for what to expect from the meeting.

Referee Education:

Referee assignors clinic. According to the United States Soccer Federation (USSF), the role of the assignor is to see “that all referees are provided proper assignments to ensure their development, retention, and opportunities for advancement.” Assignors are required to possess the ability “to assign referees confidently and accurately to matches at all levels using the guidelines established.”
