New Mexico Youth Soccer Association Annual General Meeting, August 7, 2021 Via Zoom at 11:00 AM Executive Director Report- Gloria Faber

I don't think any of us would have imagined the effects of the pandemic on youth sports across the country, moreover soccer in New Mexico. It was a trying year of closures in New Mexico and although we were the last state in the country to open for youth sports, we are thrilled to finally be back out on the pitch and playing the sport we love so much. We are cognizant that it will take time to fully rebuild and reengage our players/families, but we are committed to doing even if we experience some setbacks. I am truly amazed at how quickly the soccer community along with other sports organizations in New Mexico unified and collaborated to get kids back playing again safely. Thank you to all of those that were part of our re-opening committee spending hours on zoom calls, exchanging emails, and making calls to advocate for our youth players. Special thanks to Chris Hurst and Jason Moran for their persistence/collaboration and to Bill Nordin for taking the lead with NMAA, (grateful). Kudos to our member leagues and clubs that found ways to navigate the obstacles. The soccer community clearly lead the way advocating for the safe re-opening of youth sports and continues to set the example, putting safety and compliance at the forefront.

NMYSA's long term sustainability was first and foremost. As such, we had to make some tuff choices regarding cost cutting. We estimated that if we opened for spring, we would likely register much smaller numbers, (5K) so we focused on cost cutting and applying for available grants. Fortunately, we received grants of \$15,000 from the State of NM, \$15,000 from USSF, \$56,547 from USYS, \$7,000 from DICKS and applied and received forgiveness for a PPP loan of \$41,000., for a total of \$133,647. We also registered 3 thousand more players than estimated. On the cost cutting side, we furloughed the entire staff September 1, 2020. Rick Flores and I voluntarily worked throughout the furlough while Mysha and Michael made themselves available for calls and periodic meetings. I am truly grateful for the staff's commitment during the closures and thankful that we were eventually able to bring everyone back into the fold. Financially NMYSA's is in a good position without having to dip into reserves.



Special shout out to Rick, who selflessly worked each day providing courses and communication to our coaches. The dedication by the staff, Board, and member leagues is truly admirable!

We are cautiously optimistic about our future and are already working towards the new, modified, and continued programing offerings.

Programs

APS/NMYSA Middle School League

We have been told that the APS middle school league will be fully funded by the City of Albuquerque for the 21-22 season, so we are looking at a modified/COVID safe league for this fall/spring. Consideration is being giving to a futsal/street soccer format instead of a traditional league but will know more on how we proceed based on survey results and ability to comply with CSP.

We are also excited about the potential of Middle School Soccer in other communities, specifically Las Cruces Public Schools!

State Cup/NM/Tournaments

We were able to play the 2021 State Cup in a modified format over two Sunday and qualify teams for the Far West Regional tournament in Salt Lake, (U12s) and Idaho, (U13-U19). We had 13 teams travel to regionals and had a great showing despite just starting league play in April. We look forward to getting back on track with all tournaments beginning in August. We are also working with Visit Albuquerque Sports Commission to renew our rebate program for the new season.

TOPSoccer

Michael has been working with a couple of clubs on startup programs for TOPSoccer so we are hopeful to get programming back running again. We had agreed to host the 2023 USYS West Region TOPSoccer symposium but it looks like we may move that up to 2022 and host both the Mid-West and West Region combined symposiums in the Albuquerque area. This is a great symposium, and we are delighted to host in NM!



Innovate to Grow - Futsal/Panna Cage

Although USSF suspended the grant program during the pandemic and gave recipients extensions on implementation, we will be back in action for the 21-22 season. Our grant was to introduce futsal to NM by hosting 4 futsal tournaments and to provide member outreach with use of the Panna Cage. We have the equipment so we will be announcing futsal dates soon. If you have an event you would like for us to attend, please contact any of our staff and we will get you scheduled.

ODP/YOP

The 2021 ODP Regional Championships were cancelled so programing was put on hold until May when the West Region decided to host ODP summer camps in Colorado and California. Rick quickly arranged training centers to identify players for the camps, (in a team format) for this season. We had 365 players tryout out and 164 selected to teams. The ODP program provides the elite level players an opportunity to be identified for Inter-regional and National teams and is also a college recruiting/showcasing opportunity.
